Introduction

- To examine the relationship between the vernacular rhetoric and the post-disaster museum with special reference to the Mount Merapi Museum (Museum Gunung Merapi) in Yogyakarta, Indonesia.
- Different cultures, settings, history, and community interact with technology, global culture, disaster situated aspects may create a web of connection to the museum space with fertile materials to the study of rhetoric.
- Understanding that museum is a fertile ground of webs of symbolic systems, helps in observing the trajectory of ideas, message, and significances of this discursive spaces which was engraved by the postdisaster situation and memory within the complex culture of the global south.
- Focus on the dialectic aspects between communication and disaster.






Literature Review

- Michael Bernard-Donals (2001) write carefully on the rhetoric and disaster originated from the trauma theory of Maurice Blanchot, "Never to forget that which we cannot remember, let alone know."
- Ono and Sloop (1995) introduce the language of the oppressed community to construct their subject identity compare to the dominant cultural ideology.
- Dante has identified the issue of recognizing the vulgar voices of the peasants into the language of vernacular by setting out six characteristics from Cicero.
- McGeehan (2017) qualitative study about the role of faith in disaster experiences in Hawaiian Islands. The results suggest that faith community able to increase the level of preparedness to disasters, and facilitate the communications between individuals of faith group to reduce the impact of disasters.
- Fikih kebencanaan or coping disasters through Muhammadiyah approach taken from the understanding of disaster theology from Islam (Suyadi, Nuryana, Z., Fauzi, N.:2020).

Museum Gunung Merapi (MGM) area is a particularly easy place to get to. Research Method

Result

• Ruins as the everyday enunciations of the experiences

- The enunciation of wonder, fear, and awe are circulated in the testimonial of the victims and the media that report the situation, experiences, and testimonial during the disaster

- The language used by the victims in their poems, testimony, and photos consist of rhetorical implications that shape the collective memory of the volcanic eruption according to the people around the area.

there is a reciprocity between the cultural materials and place with the people who experience the disaster and proximity to the Merapi volcano

- Positioning victims in the post disaster museum
- Re-imagining the post-disaster land

Discussion

- The discursiveness of vernacular rhetoric in the post disaster area emerge and function through the interdependent relationship between space and place.
- The vernacularity of disaster in MGM is connected with the ways in which people experienced and conditioned by the discursive texts and materials of Yogyakarta as a city with strong spiritual and mythical identity.
- There is a significant gap to employ the tools of rhetorical criticism to explore how communicative practices build and maintain the meanings in the countries of the global south with the complex and enduring conversation in diversity of ethnicity, religion, folklore, mythology, and meaning of locality in the community.

Future scholarship on the rhetorical criticism on public memorials in the study setting of the global south.




Conclusions
