KESIMPULAN DAN SARAN

A. Kesimpulan

Dari penelitian yang dilakukan dengan menggunakan *Systematic Literature Review*, ditemukan banyak jenis hambatan dalam penerapan bangunan hijau. Jumlah literatur yang dipakai dan sudah melalui tahap penyaringan berjumlah 21 literatur. Negara yang dibahas pada penelitian tersebut adalah UAE, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, India, Kazakhstan, Pakistan, Japan, Malaysia, China, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, dan Thailand. Sedangkan hambatan dibagi menjadi jenis yaitu Hambatan Ekonomi dan Finansial, Hambatan Teknologi dan Pelatihan, Hambatan Pengetahuan, Hambatan Politik, Hambatan yang berhubungan dengan Waktu, dan Hambatan Lainnya. Hambatan yang paling sering muncul adalah kurangnya edukasi, pengetahuan, atau informasi yang terjadi di 11 negara, untuk urutan kedua adalah kurangnya personel yang berkualifikasi serta kurangnya insentif finansial yang sama sama terjadi di 11 negara. Sedangkan untuk jenis hambatan yang memiliki hambatan terbanyak adalah jenis hambatan ekonomi dan finansial dimana jenis hambatan tersebut memiliki 32 hambatan di dalamnya.

B. Saran

Untuk penelitian lebih lanjut mengenai hambatan dalam implementasi bangunan hijau, pendekatan yang komprehensif perlu dilakukan termasuk analisis komparatif antara negara-negara dengan tingkat adopsi yang berbeda-beda untuk mengidentifikasi praktik-praktik terbaik dan studi kasus terperinci dari proyek-proyek yang berhasil dilakukan.

Mengumpulkan perspektif pemangku kepentingan dan menggabungkan data kuantitatif dan kualitatif juga dapat memberikan pandangan secara keseluruhan tentang tantangan dan solusi.
